Slide Grease

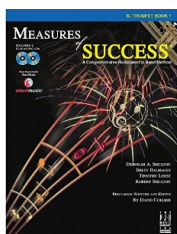
Schilke slide grease with lanolin is the best! Use to grease your tuning slide and valve slides every month or two.
